LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR


I've said it more times than I can count: this is the hardest, most rewarding job I've ever had. Anti-hunger work may not be easy, but the Bread Line is making a real difference in Fairbanks. Our mission is to "feed people & affirm lives" & that's exactly what we do, every day.

Recently, the Bread Line has been serving a record amount of food to a record amount of people. All Bread Line programs are free to anyone who needs them including: chef-prepared meals at our weekday soup kitchen, the 12-week culinary job training course, the thriving downtown community garden, the kids' volunteering initiative... all with an incredible staff of just six! However, none of this big work happens in a vacuum. The Bread Line is lifted up by people like you - people who believe that everyone deserves a hot meal in a warm place & the opportunity to live a safer life. Ongoing support from volunteers, our board, donors, funders & partner agencies keep the Bread Line going no matter what.

Living With Hunger

A NEED UNMET BY DAILY FULFILLMENT

Hunger rates trend with poverty rates because food insecurity is directly tied to personal income. According to the National Coalition for the Homeless, the main causes of food insecurity in the United States are:

- Unemployment
- High housing costs
- Low wages & poverty
- Lack of access to SNAP benefits (food stamps)
- Medical & health care costs

In 2021, Feeding America's "Map the Meal Gap" estimated Alaska's overall food insecurity rate at 12.9% - **that is 1 in 8 Alaskans who face hunger daily.**

Hunger hurts. People facing chronic hunger suffer social distress, anxiety, anger, depression, gastrointestinal issues, dizziness, headaches, hypersensitivity, poor judgment & many other issues. These negative impacts complicate daily activities & reduce a person's capacity to navigate the world - especially if the effects of poverty & hunger are compounded by other ongoing systems of discrimination.

Systemic injustice & social inequity means that Black, Brown & Indigenous communities, people living with disability & those with severe mental illness are disproportionately over-represented in the American demographics of poverty. However, people who experience poverty do not fit any one description; no one is "safe" from the possibility of economic hardship.

While we cannot solve all the world's problems alone, *each one of us can help.* At the Bread Line, our anti-hunger work is a daily commitment to building a better tomorrow, together, one meal at a time.

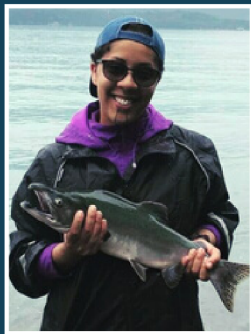

2021 at the Bread Line

AT A GLANCE

2021 AT THE BREAD LINE

"FEEDING PEOPLE & AFFIRMING LIVES"

The Bread Line has served Fairbanks since 1984. Through four robust anti-hunger programs & the support of the community, we are making a difference... together.



STONE SOUP CAFE

The Bread Line's weekday soup kitchen, the Stone Soup Cafe, served **47,115 free meals** in 2021. This is down slightly from 2020's record high of 48,871 meals but still far above our annual average.

With the switch to to-go service, we have seen our sack lunches **more than double** in the last two years.

COVID-19

In this ongoing public health emergency, Fairbanks' most marginalized residents have had fewer ways to stay warm, access basic hygiene resources & other services.

Our neighbors who live in extreme poverty are a high-risk population. **Nearly 40% of people experiencing homelessness have a chronic disease.** To mitigate spread, the Bread Line employed clear health

guidelines under the advice of local health care professionals. With their help, we haven't missed a day of service throughout the pandemic.

Thank you to our community partners helping those we serve: **Tanana Chiefs Conference, Foundation Health, Public Health, the Interior Community Health Center, the United Way of the Tanana Valley, the Fairbanks Area Citizen Corps & everyone who handmade masks.**

VOLUNTEERS!

Volunteers put in a total of 1,710 shifts to serve a total of **3,870 hours** in 2021! That's **300 more volunteers, serving 600 more hours** than last year!

With just **six people** staffing the Bread Line, this work is only possible through the support of the Fairbanks community.



STONE'S THROW

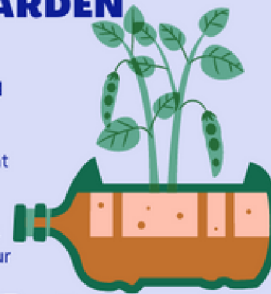
Since launching in 2015, the Stone's Throw culinary job training program has graduated 41 students & boasts an **84% employment rate post-graduation.** Running just two adult classes annually, its small class size allows for an education tailored to the needs of each student.

Additionally, Stone's Throw offers a summer program inside the Fairbanks Youth Facility. These sessions teach the incarcerated youth skills to cook for themselves, the option to obtain their food handler's card & the opportunity to join the adult class after their release.

STONE SOUP COMMUNITY GARDEN

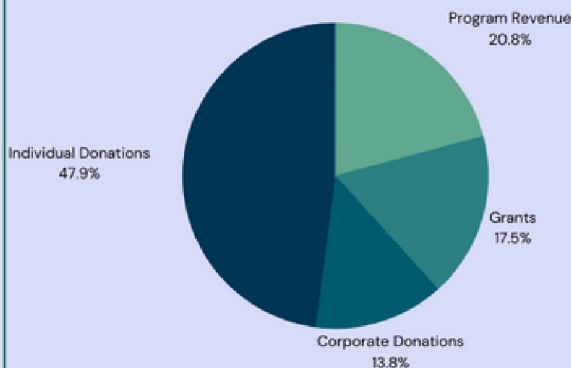
The Stone Soup Community Garden is located in downtown Fairbanks on a lot generously donated by the **Fairbanks Memorial Hospital Foundation.** In 2021, the garden **harvested 975lbs of produce.** However, much more found its way into bellies. Our community garden dedicates several beds as an "eating garden" where hungry people pick fresh produce right at the source.

We also partnered with the **Senior Center's Meals on Wheels** program & local assisted living facilities to donate **400lbs** of our own **fresh, locally grown produce** to those in need.



2021 INCOME

The anti-hunger work of the Bread Line is largely sustained by the ongoing generosity of the people of Fairbanks. The support of our community allows our programs to remain **FREE** for the people who most need them.



FOOD DONATIONS

A dramatic pandemic-related decrease in food donations saw us taking in just 32,721lbs in 2020. This jumped back up to 48,669lbs in 2021!

Individual Fairbanksans, the Fairbanks Community Food Bank & the Fairbanks Memorial Hospital are our three biggest contributors.

BREAD LINE'S WEEKDAY SOUP KITCHEN



STAFF

The Stone Soup Cafe staff is small but mighty!

Chef Matt Davis came to the Bread Line almost eight years ago following a career in high-end cooking. Matt uses his impressive professional skills to make *delicious* meals from largely donated food.

Cafe Manager Abby Waldorf is the newest addition to the Bread Line team, joining in 2021. Abby brings her dedication to human dignity & an even keel to the morning service, making every day possible.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF THE STONE SOUP CAFE



Chef Matt arrives first to the Bread Line. Using donated & reclaimed food, Chef Matt makes oatmeal, soup & a hot entree for the morning meal service. Around 6:30AM, the first volunteers arrive. They package meals, process incoming food donations, wash dishes & make sandwiches for the following day.

The soup kitchen's Cafe Manager, Abby, is next to the Stone Soup Cafe. She makes sure the Cafe is stocked & ready to go. As more volunteers arrive, they prepare for the day's service. At 7:30AM, Abby unlocks the doors & meal service begins! Volunteers serve Chef Matt's delicious hot meals, cold sack lunches, vitamins, juice, coffee & water to the guests. **In 2021, the Stone Soup Cafe gave out 47,115 free meals to Fairbanks' hungry neighbors.** The Stone Soup Cafe also provides hygiene kits, first aid items, hats, socks, gloves, hand warmers & more - when available. During service, Abby makes sure that the volunteers have what they need, that everything is safe & keeps an eye out for any medical emergencies that may arise.

The Bread Line's **Stone Soup Cafe is a low-barrier facility**; we do not require proof of need, sobriety, ID or anything that may prevent someone from accessing a hot meal in a safe place. Guests at the soup kitchen have a choice of what they would like to eat & drink. Monday through Friday, the Stone Soup Cafe serves between 80 & 100 hot meals a day & just as many cold sack lunches, too. Importantly, the soup kitchen is also a place of community. Everyone is welcome here.

After service, it's time to deep clean the soup kitchen & get ready to do it all again the next day!

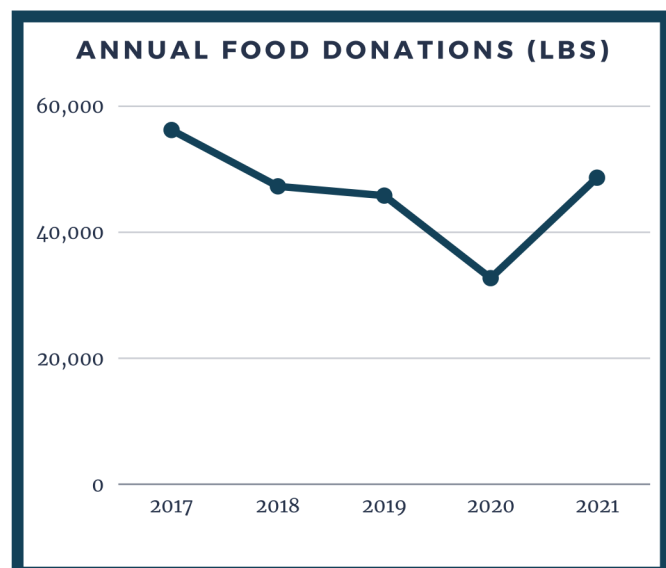
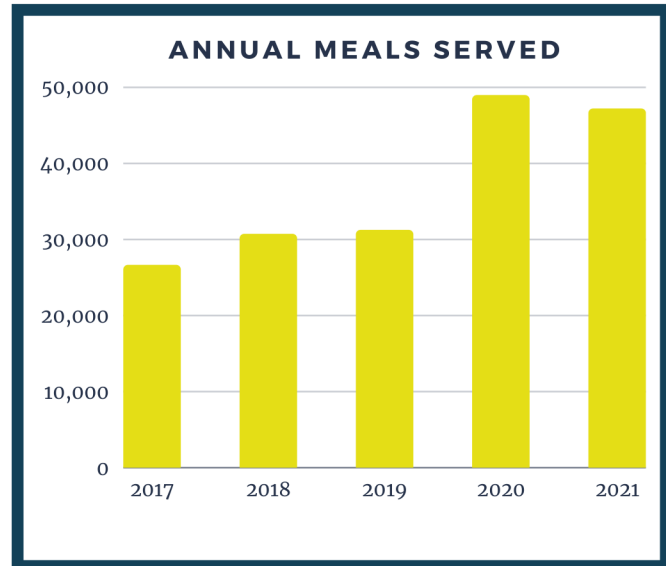
SERVING IN A PANDEMIC

Mr. Rogers tells us to "look for the helpers" when life is scary & - throughout the pandemic - the Bread Line has always been a place to find helpers.

COVID-19 changed the way we served but did not stop us from serving. During tumultuous times of lockdowns & quarantine, the Stone Soup Cafe adopted numerous safety measures to keep our community as safe as possible. Because the Bread Line team took this public health crisis seriously & committed to being "COVID conscious," we never missed a day of service nor did any viral outbreaks spread within our building, despite being a frontline, direct service agency.

Our gratitude goes out to the dedicated community health professionals who helped us stay safer in our daily service: Tanana Chiefs Conference, Chief Andrew Isaac, Foundation Health, Public Health & the Interior Community Health Center. Also, thank you to the United Way of the Tanana Valley & the Fairbanks Area Citizen Corps as well as every Fairbanksan who made masks by hand when we could not source any & to everyone who donated money, time, food & cleaning supplies to sustain us during this incredibly difficult time.

The pandemic increased community need for emergency food services. In early 2020, the Stone Soup Cafe saw a 42% increase in meals services almost over night. This alarming spike has held into 2022. We do not know when we will return to "normal" service, but we continue to do our best with what we have, everyday.

Chef Marisa Peña joined the Bread Line in 2019 as the Program Manager for the Bread Line's culinary job training program, Stone's Throw. With Marisa's corporate restaurant background, Stone's Throw has grown steadily in scope, scale & service. Marisa also handles the Bread Line's robust catering program.

Chef Liann Peryea is a 2015 graduate of the Stone's Throw program. She returned the following year to run a summer food service program before joining the Bread Line team permanently in 2017 as a Chef Instructor for Stone's Throw. Liann also runs the Bread Line's contract meal program, creating nutritious & delicious meals for local harm-reduction agencies seven days a week.

Stone's Throw culinary training empowers people overcoming challenges to **change their lives through job readiness training & skills development opportunities.**

Since launching in 2015, this intensive 12-week program has **graduated 41 students & boasts an 84% employment rate.** Running two adult classes annually (fall & winter), our small class size allows for an education tailored to the needs of each student.

In 2021, Sean Enfield returned for his 3rd season managing the Stone Soup Community Garden. An enthusiastic community collaborator, Sean brought the garden into fullness. Over the last few years, the garden has also had huge help from two summer VISTAs: Fairbanks' very own Daisy Morotti & Smitty McGowan (up all the way from Wisconsin!).

GROWING & SHARING & EATING

The Stone Soup Community Garden, established in 2015, is located downtown, at 11th & Lacey, on a lot donated by the Greater Fairbanks Community Hospital Foundation & tended by DOZENS of volunteers.

2021 harvested 975lbs of produce for the Stone Soup Cafe soup kitchen. However, much more found its way directly into bellies. Our garden dedicates several beds as an "eating garden" so hungry people can pick produce right at the source. We also partnered with the Senior Center's Meals on Wheels program, ThrivAlaska & several local assisted living facilities to donate an additional 400lbs of fresh, locally grown produce to those in need.

Sean, who recently joined the Bread Line's year-round team as Administrative Coordinator, shared the story of the garden in the Fall 2021 issue of Edible Alaska (available online). Being committed to food justice is no easy labor, but as Sean says in his article, we rise to challenges & "continue to grow."

BREAD LINE BY THE NUMBERS

A WORD FROM THE BREAD LINE'S TREASURER

2021 has been a banner year for the Bread Line. With over \$100K in net profit, the Bread Line is fiscally very healthy under Hannah's leadership.

When I began working with the Bread Line, the Board was considering the elimination of a cornerstone program. In just a few years, Hannah, the Bread Line employees, volunteers & the Board have fortified the Bread Line's short term & long-term stability; shored up funding & food supply lines; reached all-time high individual donations & grants; & has fed more people & affirmed more lives than ever before. All of these accomplishments happened during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. The Bread Line has stepped up in so many ways & it shows.

I was part of the financial team in 2019, board member in 2020 & elected treasurer in 2021. When I started working with the BLI board, we were looking at what programs to cut because of financial instability. The BLI was in the red in 2019. However, we were determined to not close any programs. Hannah, Kristina & I revamped the treasurer's report to be a meaningful display of the Bread Line program's assets, expenses, & revenue. We figured out what revenue was needed for each program to be fully operational & sustainable. Using this information, Hannah, BLI staff & the Board made smart fiscal decisions. This means that over the past several years, the Bread Line has come out so far ahead that it is able to build on long-term savings, hire employees, maintain stable food funds, increase donations & build its grants portfolio.

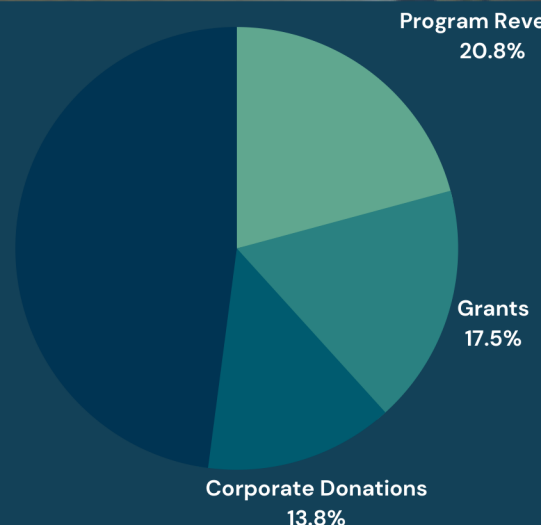

2022 Budget

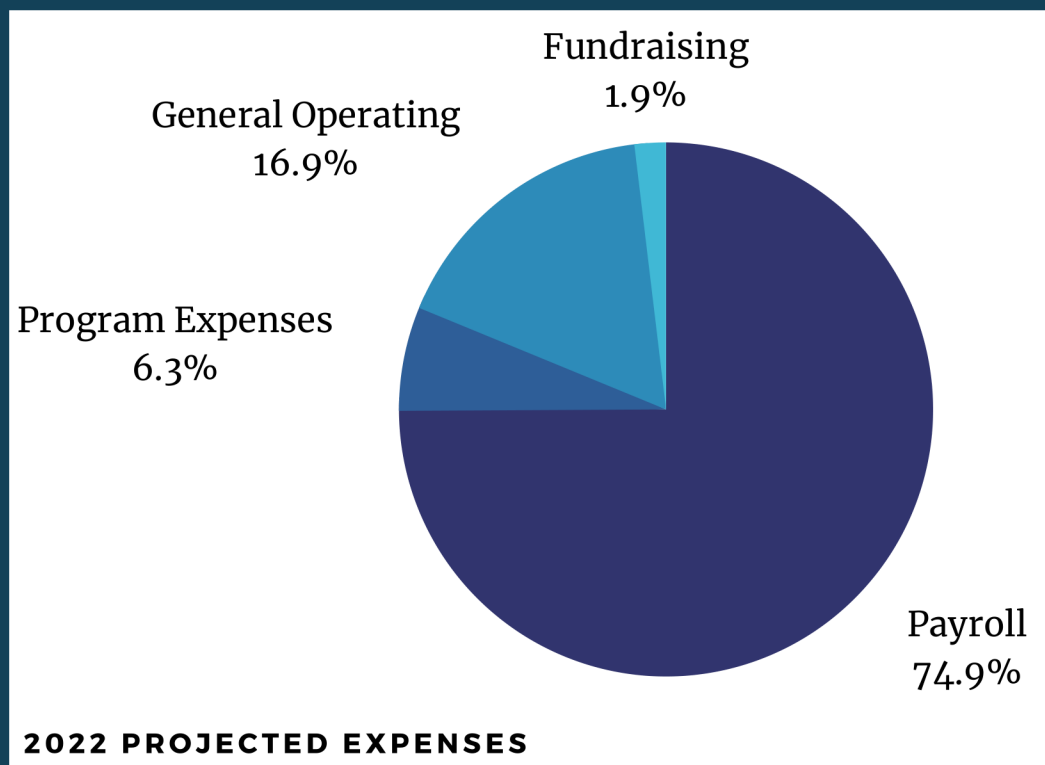
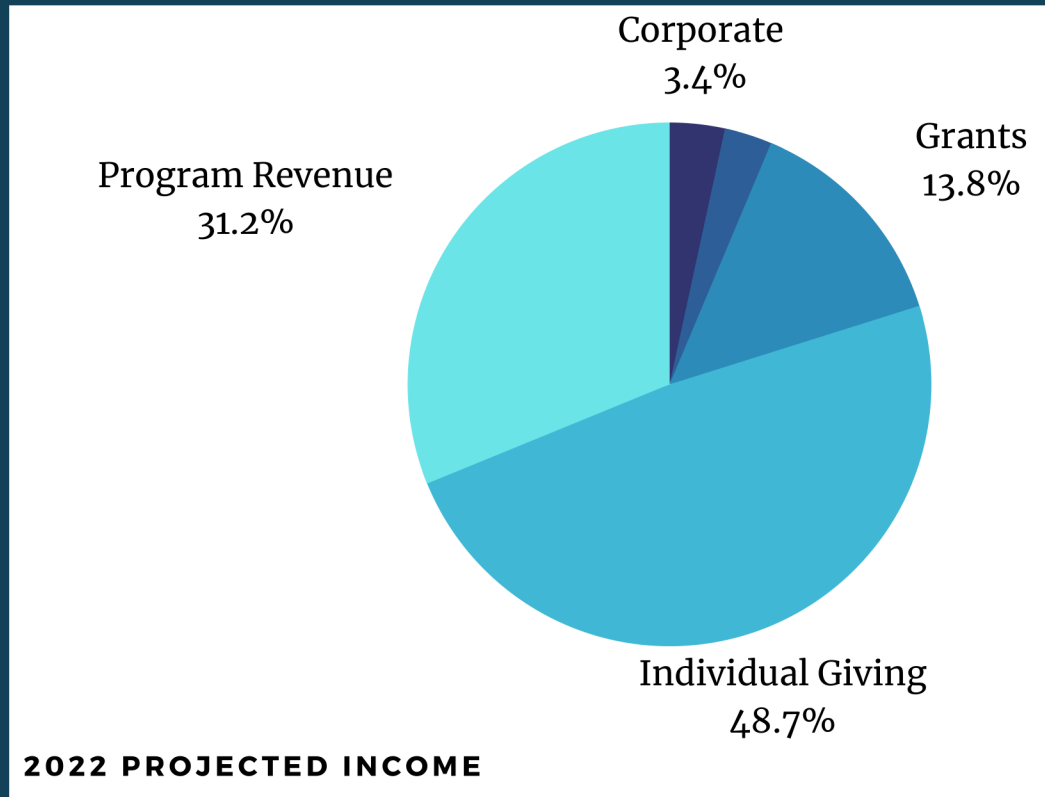
LOOKING FORWARD

The anti-hunger work of the Bread Line is sustained by the generosity of Alaskans. The support of our commUNITY allows Bread Line programs to remain free for the people who need us.

Our approach to maintaining a healthy income stream is a three-pronged system of individual giving, earned income & grant work. The pandemic impacted how the Bread Line makes money but the resiliency of this system protected our operations.

Not reflected here is the intangible but critical in-kind food donations that allow us to maximize revenue, minimize cost & maintain the level of service that the Bread Line is known for. Because so much of our daily materials are donated, program & general operating expenses are comparatively low. The largest single expense of the Bread Line is payroll for our hardworking staff members.

Excitingly, Solarize Fairbanks, a community-led solar initiative, campaigned to get a new solar photovoltaic array at the Bread Line! Local solar experts, Renewable Energy Systems are installing this in summer 2022, which will help further reduce the Bread Line's daily operating expenses.

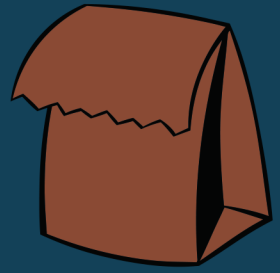
